



Nothing but Sky You'd have to be crazy to jump from a perfectly good airplane at 18,000 feet for a 90 second free-fall, but that didn't stop senior Daniel Urban from taking part in the highest tandem sky-dive in the world. "I've wanted to sky dive since I was 13," Urban said. Jumping at the Opportunity Senior David Troner plummets to earth while adventure-seeking with Urban at Skydive Space Center in Titusville. Urban turned 18 during the summer, a requirement to legally sky dive. When Troner turned 18 a few months later, they were ready to jump. "It was an adrenaline rush. It was a really surreal experience," Troner said. "The scariest part was signing the 15-page waiver that stated all the ways you could die." Post-Flight Celebration After reaching the ground, the friends celebrate their jump. "I wanted to stay up there forever," Urban said. "Everything was small. People and cars looked like ants and I want to do it again." Said Troner: "I liked it better in the air, and I wish it would have lasted longer. I felt like a bird flying through the sky."
